Brief description:

Part I of this workshop provide an introduction to the development and scope of the *Clinical Descriptions and Diagnostic Guidelines (CDDG) for ICD-11 Mental, Behavioural or Neurodevelopmental Disorders*. The CDDG is designed for use by mental health professionals in clinical settings, developed by the WHO Department of Mental Health and Substance Use.

Part II, the workshop will inform about the structure, diagnostic guidelines, and differential diagnoses for the chapter on Schizophrenia and Other Primary Psychotic Disorders.

Each part will have a discussion portion; Part II will also emphasize interactive participation through application of the new guidelines to clinical vignettes based on real cases and discussion of diagnostic dilemmas.

The training workshop will mainly address psychiatrists in clinical practice. Material on the main features of the new ICD-11 guidelines and changes from ICD-10 will be presented by leading global experts who led key aspect of the development of the ICD-11. The workshop will cover some of the areas of most central concern to psychiatric practice and that account for the greatest proportion of mental health service utilization.
